### Upholding the law

## Infringement procedures update as per 25 November 2024

The European Union is constitutionally designed as a Union of Law. According to the Treaties (Treaty on European Union, Treaty on Functioning of the European Union), Member States are obliged to comply with EU legislation adopted by the legislator (European Parliament and Council), and the Commission has the right and the obligation to scrutinise such compliance and where appropriate take legal action.

Past weeks saw a range of infringement procedures, from the Seveso Directive to EU nature protection legislation and from the Water Framework Directive to the Drinking Water Directive, against the following Member States:

The Commission is at the same time closing a three-digit number of cases in which the issues with the Member States concerned have been solved without the Commission needing to pursue the procedure further.
